Amen I George Morrison of said State and County being of advanced age and knowing that I must shortly depart from this world, deem it right and proper both as respect myself and family that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind providence has blessed me, I therefore make this my last Will and Testament.

I desire and direct that my body be buried in decent and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances, and condition. My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it, as I hope for eternal salvation through the blessed Lord and Savior Jesus Christ whom religion I have professed and as I humbly trust enjoyed for a number of years.

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors hereinafter named.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret Lyles and her children a negro girl Nelly about twenty year old, Harriet about ten and Cherry about five year old. To my son John H. I give and bequeath a negro

man Louie about twenty two years  
old and his wife Phoebe about twenty  
years old and her mother a  
boy Lawrence ten years old, also  
six Bales Cotton now on hand  
to my son James D. I give a negro  
man Sam about twenty years  
old, Liddy a woman about twenty  
years old a boy Bob about ten  
years old, also six Bales Cotton  
on hand to my daughter Sarah D.  
McDonald I give a negro girl  
Elly about twenty years old, Maria  
a girl about seven years old to  
my daughter Charity G. I give a  
negro girl Charlotte about seven  
years old, a girl Rose four  
years old. to my my grand daughter  
Ada and my grand son John  
Sulins children of my grand  
daughter Mary Ann Lyles I  
give a negro woman Bella and  
her two children Sue and John  
I constitute and appoint my son  
John D. Spaulding, of the person  
and property of my said grand  
children. The balance of Cotton  
on hand and money on hand and  
all debts due me, I desire to be  
equally divided among my son  
all the balance of my property real  
and personal I give to my  
beloved wife Susan during her  
lifetime or widowhood at her

death to be equally divided among  
my heirs  
I constitute and appoint my sons  
John K. and James D. Executors  
to this my last will and Testament  
This 1st day of May 1864.
