Will and Testament in manner following
that is to say

I hereby certify that after all my just debts
and burial expenses have been paid the
rest of my property shall be written in
the following manner

I will and bequeath to J. David Brad
in trust for Weston Brad dock his da
ughter the following property to wit
I have I want a negro woman
Two children besides also I give and
bequeath five silver tea spoons &
wearing apparel one gold ring &
string beads and two trunks

I give and bequeath to my beloved
Mary Edwards one clock one tin
cup and four large spoons six tick
spoons & one table & one Band Box
and after all my debts are paid
the remaining part of my property
to be equally divided among
Brothers William Brad dock
Berry and Mary Edwards
property that will

There is no trust for S. J. John
But the following is the balance
of my real and personal estate
That is to be divided among my sons
Frederick and son John William &
Marshall also one share and two in
the Town of Somers being part of
lot 11 one also I give and bequeath
to them all the right I have to a
tract of land on Abbeville Island left
me by my Mother and all the
remainder of my estate to be divided
among them equally and lastly I
do make Constable and Ordains —
William Barry sole executor of this
my last will and testament —

memory and that he did also see
Samuel Griffin and John Hays sign
their names as witnesses thereto
