

Love Spring Will's Testament

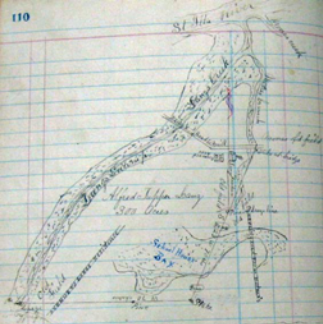
In the name of God Amen.
 I, Love Spring of Cambridge place in the County of
 Camden and State of Georgia, being that should be
 allowed to remain. I call the time allotted the minutes
 by me to write. I received & feel as we have many
 years longer and living with the great mountain
 of our hold on life as well as our very own of our
 and our own mind and body. The more that we
 look to it and our own, it is better.
 I have that we only may be lived by the
 of my mind. I have in the living mind place
 to live and breathe to my child. I have
 to live and all that written of my mind, but
 on the left side of what is known as, (and it
 is described at the consolidated plot of my
 lands made by Mr. Luther (Hull) Spring and

Kindly I enclose and beneath to my next sheet an
index map of that portion of our land from
on the East side of Long creek and bounded later
what are known as Moose Creek and Moose River
the boundary line of the patent being at the mouth
of Long creek on the East of the river and following
the said creek up to a point above the lower
Moose branch joining the branch following the
channel of Moose Creek to the bridge on the road
leading from Gallatin bluff to Little Bluff, then
in a southerly direction 33° East - with course in
line in a field near Santa Fe East sixty six
degrees to corner on channel of Moose River (the
continuation of Moose Creek) and then the corner
of Moose branch and creek to its mouth on the
Pattee river, the attached plat marked for my

Fourth. I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary
Larkin Bay, that part of my lands lying
East of Henry's claim, and adjoining to the
Hired Tuffer Bay. The lines enclosing the
land which I give to my daughter Mary Larkin
Bay, begins at the N. W. corner of the
two statutes on the East border of Henry's claim
and a short distance below where the third and
fourth claims meet, and runs South 85° East
thence three chains to Pine corner, thence
the border of said swamp, and at distance

6th I give and bequeath to my eldest son
Robert Stephen Lang my parcel more
named Cassie.

I give and bequeath to all the rest and residue
of my estate and effects, as well real as personal
whenever situated and being, and of what
nature and kind soever they consist at the
time of my decease and not herein before given
and bequeathed, I do hereby give twice and
beneath the same, and to my son and grand
children, my four children, Frederick
Thompson Lang, Robert Lang, Mary Louisa
Lang, and Alfred Stephen Lang, and their
heirs forever, and in equal shares and
proportions.

I And I do hereby nominate and appoint
my wife Cornelius S. Lang and William
Lang who resides at Mount Fort to be
Executors of this my last Will and testament
in witness whereof I the said Testator
Isaac Lang have to this my last Will at
my hand and seal this the seventh day
of May, in the year 1867.

Item 1st I give, bequeath, and devise to my daughter Harriet Parrish
the following property, to wit - 4 Head of milking cows and
also free from all charge and limitation whatever to her own
proper use, benefit and behoof.

Item 2nd I give, bequeath, and devise to my next daughter Annie
Parrish the following property, to wit - 5 Head of milking cows, and one Yoke of Steers to have, and free
from all charge or limitation whatever to her own proper use
benefit and behoof.

Item 3rd I give, bequeath, and devise to my other two daughters, Eliza
and Dixie I Parrish the following property, to wit - Three milking
cows, and two yokes of oxen to have and to hold the same in and
for their life, then to vest and become the property of the
children or children of the said Harriet, Annie and Eliza and Dixie
I Parrish living at their death, and if any such child or child-
ren be dead, leaving a child or children then alive, such issue
to take share of such deceased child. but if the said
Harriet Parrish should survive all of such child or child-
ren or issue of such child or children then said property, to wit
absolutely in said Annie Parrish.

Item 4th I hereby constitute and appoint my Husband, Bayard
Phillips, Executor of my last Will and Testament
