

Last Will and Testament of James W. Barclay,

State of Georgia, Camden County,

I, James Walter Barclay of said County and State being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking, all will heretofore made by me.

Item 1st - I wish my Executor as soon as possible after my death to pay my debts.

Item 2^d - I give and bequeath to my beloved sister Wilma Mullin, the entire amount realized from Policies, No 14218 & 79097, amounting to over thousand (\$1000) dollars, cash to be paid to her in full and free from all claims, what so ever of my Estate or any one claiming in to or through me.

One of said Policies, No 14218 being in the "Mutual Life Insurance Association" and the other No 79099 being in the Mutual Life Insurance Association.

Item 3^d - I give and bequeath to my Brother Mitchell Barclay, the sum of One dollar (\$1), also to my Sister Ada Barclay, the sum of One dollar, (\$1), also to my Sister Emma Barclay the sum of One dollar, (\$1).

Item 4th - I give and bequeath to my father J. S. Barclay, the remainder of my Estate whatsoever it may be, for his wife and heirs, heirs and behoof free from any and all claims whatsoever, of my Estate or any one claiming in to and through me.

Item 5th - I hereby appoint my friend and

brother in law, H. H. Mullin, Executor of this my Will, and it is my direction, that no Bond be required of him.

Item 6th - I desire that my body be laid beside my wife, and child, in my loved lot, and that a stone suitable to my circumstances in life be sent over my grave, in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 20th day of July, 1908.
