

First Will or Statement of James W. Basley,

State of Georgia - Camden County.

I James Weller Basley, of said County and State being of sound and disposing Mind and Memory, do make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all wills heretofore made by me.

Item 1st - I wish my Executor as soon as possible after my death to pay my debt.

Item 2nd - I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, Wilma Mullin, the Entire Amount Received from Policies, No. 14218 and 79097, Amounting to One Thousand (\$1000.00) Dollars, each to be paid to her in full and free from all Claims, where soever of my Estate, or my One Claiming in to or through me.

One of said Policies, No 14218 lying in the "Majorie Canal" and the Other No 79097 lies in the Mutual Life Insurance Association.

Item 3rd - I give and bequeath to my Brother Mitchell Basley, the sum of One dollar (\$1.00) Also to my Sister Ade Basley, the sum of One dollar, (\$1.00). Also to my Sister Emma E. Basley the sum of One dollar, (\$1.00)

Item 4th - I give and bequeath to my Father J S Basley, the remainder of my Estate whatsoever it may be, in his whole sole benefit and liberty free from any and all Claims whatsoever, of my Estate or any one claiming in to and through me.

Item 5th - I hereby appoint my friend Mr

brother in law, W. H. Mullin, Executor of this my Will, and it is my direction, that no Bond be required of him.

Item 6th - I desire that my body be laid beside my wife, and child, in my casket, and that a Stone suitable to my Circumstances in life be erected over my grave. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 20th day of July 1908.
