} Before me came for witness
 } James Brown and Johnie John who said
 upon their oaths that on Saturday 25th day
 of January 1896, James Brazell, who was then
 in his house in said County, when he had
 been residing for the space of twenty years
 caused the undersigned to come to his presence
 and asked them to be witnesses that he could
 not write, but wished to make his will and
 divide to C. C. Ryals, all that certain tract of
 land lying in said County containing 80
 acres of land more or less, bounded North by
 lands of Hittom & Dodge, East by lands of Hittom
 & Dodge, South by lands of Hittom & Dodge,
 West by lands of Hittom & Dodge. Commonly
 known and described by him as the tract of land
 on which his said house was located, and at
 which he then resided, Witnesses further affirm
 that the said James Brazell, was then ill of
 his last sickness, and died within less
 than ten days after giving this land to the
 said C. C. Ryals, and the undersigned further
 say that they made XXIX and signed the instrument
 for the purpose of setting up and establishing in
 writing the said death XXIX as the true and
 will of the said James Brazell
