Secondly I give and bequeathe to the Lawful
Heirs of John Todd William Todd and Semima-
Todd All my Estate both real and personal
except Three Cows & Calves Which I give
and bequeathe to the Heirs of James Willson
of this County Which Property I wish to be
Equally divided among the Heirs of the
above named persons and lastly I nominate
and appoint John Bailey Jr of this County
my Executor to this my last Will and
Testament

In Witness of the above I hereunto Set my
Hand and Seal this Sixth day of February
Eighteen hundred & Twenty
