

Last Will of John Floyd. (Vol.)

Camden County & for the Honor of the

I, John Floyd of said State and County, being of advanced age, but of sound and disposing mind and memory, knowing that I must shortly depart this life, do in it right and proper form as respects my family and myself, that I should make a disposition of the property of which a kind Providence has blessed me, I do therefore make this my last will and testament, hereby declaring, annulling all others by me heretofore made. I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner, suitable to my Circumstances and Condition in life. My Soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it, as I hope for salvation through the merits and atonement of the Blessed Lord and having given Christ.

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors hereafter appointed.

I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Maria, Pension Certificate Number 697338, granted to me January 8th 1892 for serving as a private in Company Ath 38th Regiment United States, Colored Volunteer Infantry; with all the right, emoluments and appurtenances to said Pension Certificate No. 697338 in any wise belonging from all Georgia, and limitation whatever of her own

paper was bequeathed and bequeathed, personal, whatever and whatever it may be, I give and bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Maria for and during her natural life, and after her death to my children or the representatives of them. I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Maria Executor of this my last Will and Testament.
