 in Suffolk County State of Connecticut to
 have sole use and benefit forever - - - - -
 2ndly It is my desire that a new & convenient
 after my decease all my Real Estate be
 freely & absolutely given at their death
 under the power of the will to the eldest
 son for the term of years and of age and of
 his heirs forever - - - - -
 3rdly It is to be understood that the three are
 equally liable for all commissions & charges
 payable to the amount of their respective
 & given under my hand and
 Seal at New Haven the 14th day of February
 in the year of our Lord 1763 and of our
 Independence the 13th day of February 1776
