

Will of Joseph L. Annow.

In the name of God, Amen!
I, Joseph L. Annow, of the city of St. Mary's, in the county of Camden and State of Georgia, of the age of eighty-four years, and being of sound mind and memory, do make, publish and declare this my last will and testament, in manner following, that is to say:
First, I give and bequeath to my sons, George and Peter the sum of three hundred dollars, each.

And, lastly, after all my funeral expenses are paid, and a tombstone for myself, one for my late wife and one for my daughter, Julia, be procured and erected, I give and bequeath all the rest and residue and remainder of my property, of what nature or kind soever, should there be anything left, to all my children, George, Joseph W., Peter, Mary, and Josephine, to be divided equally between them share and share alike. I hereby appoint Peter Annow and James A. Grady, executors of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills, by me made.
