I do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say Principally and first of all I recommend my immortal Soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner.

And as to such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to blep me in this life I give and dispose of the same in manner and form following to wit

First I order and direct that my funeral expences and the nursing trouble and expence of my friend Samuel M^cBerarn of the District of Chatham in the County of Philadelphia be fully paid and Satisfied together with Forty Guineas which is to be placed in the hands of John Moorhead or in his absence Joseph Cummings of Savannah in the State of Georgia for the purpose of being remitted to my Brother Joseph Smith of Belfast Ireland for the sole use and benefit of my Mother Elizabeth Smith

Secondly I order and direct that all my just and Lawful debts be duly paid and Satisfied as soon as Convenience can be after my decease, by my Executors hereinafter named

And as to all the rest residue and remainings

of my Estate Real and Personal of what
Kind or Nature soever the same may be in
the County of Cumberland and State of Georgia
aforesaid or else where I give and devise
the same unto my loving wife Mary and
equally and in conjunction with my five
daughters viz Elizabeth Mariah Rebecca
Mary Martha and Catharine to be equally
parted and divided among them here and there
able and to be paid and delivered unto my said
daughters at their several respective ages of
Twenty one years or day of marriage which
shall first happen. All my will and meaning
is that in case any of my said Children shall
depart this life before such time as the part
or portion of her or them so dying shall be
come payable then in such case the part or
portion of her or them so dying shall go and
be equally divided among the survivors or
survivor of them Share and Share alike if
more than one and to be paid to such survivors
or survivor at the time aforesaid.

Thirdly I hereby order and direct that
it is my will that my Beloved wife shall
any on manage order and direct all my
former business as it has heretofore been carried
on managed and conducted according to the
best of her judgment and abilities in order
to promote the welfare and comfort of herself
and my Beloved Children. And I do appoint
that my said dear wife shall have the full
use and possession of them so long as she shall
continue to be sole and in case she shall

or Marriage during the minority of such my
Children then I will and appoint that my
much esteemed friend William Gibson Esquire
and Robert Miller shall have the full and
entire charge of them during such their minority
and in such case I earnestly entreat their parents
care respectively in and about the morals and
education of my Children aforesaid. And lastly
I nominate constitute and appoint my Beloved
wife to be the sole Executive Trustee Executor
all other debts legacies and bequests by me
heretofore made and declaring this and no
other to be my last will and no other to be
my last will and Testament.
