Sarah, Margaret and Jane Nickels all
my property Household and Moveable
untill her death or she Marry and then
the property be equally divided between the
three Children. If Sarah

if not for her to have but one Shilling, I also
with my two horses should be sold the fall to
the best advantage and the money and what
money is at home to be put to the use of pur-
chasing a Negro Woman for the holt and as for
my negro Man I shall leave it to my wife and
my two Executors whether to sell him and
buy a Wench or hire him out to help to main-
tain the Family, as for the land thought of
Thomas Cryer I wish it never to be sold but
least or rented out for a part of the Coppany
year and kept in view and if the Negro fellow is
sold and a negro wench bought the two wench is
never to be sold by them and their Children to be
intailed to the three Gals and their children for
ever in life sum impediments and then more
are to be bought in the place of them, I draw
also Constitute, make and ordain Jacob
and William Mickler my sole and sole
Executors to then my last will and testament
and I do hereby utterly by these words revoke and
revoke null all and every ^{former} testament, Wills and
Legacies, bequests and Executors by me in any
way before named, willed, and bequeathed
Ratifying and Confirming this and know
other to be my last will and testament in
witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this seventeenth day of
June in the year of our Lord Eighteen
Hundred
