

Will of Mary, A. Cohen

State of Georgia, Camden County, October 1st 1897

In the name of God, Amen.

I know all men of this indenture that I Mary, A. Cohen being lately free from debt, and of sound mind, and firm will, and mindful of the uncertainty of human life, I feel it my duty to write down here what disposition I want made of the few earthly things that a merciful God and Father has given me.

Item 1st I do herein appoint Mr. Robt. Tompkins and Mr. John Bachbator my two Executors together with Joseph, C. Bijelen my child to to whom I give all my property of every description to have and to hold, its income for her life and not to be subject to the Control of her husband that now lives or any one she may marry in time to come. Neither shall it be liable for their debts in any way whatever but for her own self and at her own disposal. It is my earnest wish that my two acting Executors may buy and sell all my real estate on the Satilla River, as soon as they can find an opportunity to do so, and when sold give to Nora, C. Smith one thousand dollars and give to Abella her younger sister one thousand dollars from the proceeds of sales.

all the balance to give to Joseph, C. Bijelen taking out the expenses. I wish my wishes that my two Executors take immediate possession as soon as I am dead (namely, Mr. Robt. Tompkins

and Mr. John Bachbator of all my papers and all my property in said County, to do the best they can with it for the benefit of said Joseph, C. Bijelen. Given under my hand this first day of October 1897.
