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State of Georgia Camden County
Last Will and Testament of Philip Brown
I Philip Brown of said State and County being of
sound and disposing mind and memory do make
this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all
wills heretofore made by me Having Charles Connor
but Superfluous

Item 1st I wish my Executor as soon as
possible after my death to pay my debts if a
Sale of property shall be necessary I wish then to
select for Sale that which can be most
advantageously used for that purpose and I
authorize him to sell the same at public or
private Sale as he may see fit
and I give to my ^{beloved} daughter Probby Blase the
following property To wit twenty five acres of
land lying in Camden County Include the
old Homestead of Philip Brown from the
ditch between his house and John Brown
house running East and West straight
across the Kingsbury Road and down to the
Jefferson Road and she is not to cross the
Jefferson Road and bind the Sally Puckle
land North and South and all that is
around the old Homestead

Item 9 I do hereby appoint Jim Blake Executor
of this my last Will and as extra Compensation
for his services over and above Commission
give him the sum of \$100 to be taken from
the residuary funds in Testimony whereof
I have hereunto set my hand
