Considering the uncertainty of life, and being of
sound mind and memory, do make and publish
this my last Will and Testament, and hereby revoke
all others heretofore made by me, To My Wife
Isabel, I give, bequest and devise all my lands
tenements and hereditaments and appurtenances
thereunto belonging, together with all the rest and
residue of my Estate real and personal, and
mixed, wherever and whatsoever it may be, with
the rents, issues and profits thereof, to own, possess and
enjoy for and during the term of her natural life,
and after her death it is my will that the same
shall be divided equally among my Children, namely,
William, Madona, Thomas and Lee, and in case of
their death, or the death of either of them, their
Mother living then the part that they or either
of them should have received if living to go to
their legal heir or heirs respectively, and this
bequest and devise to my said Wife Isabel
I hereby declare is intended to be and is so given
to her in full satisfaction and recompense of
and for all dower or part she may or can
in any wise claim or demand out of my estate,
and I hereby constitute and appoint my two
sons Thomas and Lee my Executors of this my last
Will and Testament, In Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this 29th January
1893.
