

Last Will and Testament of William Annans

In the name of God: Amen. I William Annans of the county of Wayne and State of Georgia, being of sound mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life, do therefore make, ordain, and publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament: that is to say first, after all my lawful debts are paid and discharged, the residue of my estate real and personal, I give and bequeath to my children, Consamore Hernson & William Franklin Annans and any more who may be born during my lifetime, to be equally divided among them, as they the said children shall become of age. I desire and direct that my wife Mary Ann shall live with the children and enjoy my estate with them as long as she may remain a widow, but no longer. Likewise I direct that the portion of my estate already given to Noah Warner shall ~~remain~~ in case he the said Warner shall die without wife or children. But if he should leave said wife or children said portion shall come to them.

I make constitute, and appoint my friends Nathan Dand and James F. King to be the Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills made by me. In Witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed hereunto the French seventh day of March in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred and Seventy six
