In the Name of God Amen, I, Witness Williams of the State of Georgia & County of Camden being Struck of Body but of perfect Mind & Memory and calling to mind that it is appointed for me thus Come to die do recommend my soul to God who governs and as Touching such worldly Estate as is left behind please God to bless me with in this life as give and dispose of the same in manner and form following (Viz. —

First, I give and Bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Williams the lot of land and Improvements in the town of Saint Mary Whence I now live three Negroes Viz. Sam, Robt and Phillis, together with all and singular the Stocks and house hold furniture that I possess at this time, during her Natural life, then to be equally Divided among my Children Viz. Clinton son, Mitty Williams Rubenah Williams, William Williams and Harriette Williams. —

Secondly, I give and Bequeath unto my son Williams Williams One Tract of land lying and being in said County of Camden & more fully Containing two Hundred Acres More or less

17. Aibly and Others, also all his debts and Bonds due to be Settled and paid And as Negroes And equally Divided between my Children Viz. Mitty Williams Rubenah Williams William Williams and Harriette Williams at the discretion of my Executors

Lastly, I do make constitute and Appoint my Beloved Wife Elizabeth Williams, Executors and Mr. David Garris & Mr. James Abbe Holmes Executors to this my last will & testament hereby revoking all Other Wills by me made, I do Witness When I the said Witness Williams have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Seventh day of December Eighteen Hundred and two, And in the twenty seventh Year of the Independence of the United States of America
