

I, F.B. Harrison, of said State and county, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills heretofore made by me.

Item 1. I wish my executors as soon as possible after my death, to pay all my debts and to put slabs over my grave and over the grave of my sister Henry.

Item 2. My executors are directed to turn all my property both real and personal into cash as soon after my death as it can be done to advantage, and to this end I authorize them to sell any or all of said property either at private or public sale at such time and place as they may think to be the best advantage.

Item 3. After the payment of my debts and the sale of all of my property, and the gathering together of all of the cash obtained from the same, then it is my wish, and my executors are directed to divide said cash into four (4) parts: One part to go to the bodily heirs of my deceased sister, Margaret Bass, and them to be subdivided equally among said heirs, and should any of said heirs be deceased, then the part of said deceased shall be subdivided equally between the heirs of said deceased heir including his widow.

A second part of my estate is to go to the bodily heirs of my deceased sister, Catherine McDuffie, and be equally divided between the, to wit: Mrs. Effie Williams, R.B. McDuffie and Mrs. Georgia Ann Belcher. The last named being deceased, I wish her part to be subdivided equally between her four step children, to wit: Maud, Charlie, Clyde and Estell Belcher.

Another part of my estate is to go to the bodily heirs of my deceased sister, Mrs. Sarah M. Dudley, and be subdivided equally between her children, to wit: Mrs. Mary Jones and Angus M. Dudley.

Another part of my estate is to go to the descendants of my deceased brother, J.C. Harrison, who left one son, H.F. Harrison, who is also deceased, leaving a widow, Mrs. Elizabeth Harrison and three sons, Clifford, Elmer and John Harrison. This part of my estate shall be subdivided equally between Elizabeth Harrison and her three sons Clifford, Elmer and John Harrison.

Item 4. I hereby appoint George A. Bass, Angus M. Dudley and R.B. McDuffie as executors of this my last will, who shall serve without bond, and without making any returns to any court. Should any of them be unable to serve or should either of

them die, then the remainder of them shall execute the will. In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand, this 22nd. day of March, 1928.
