

I, Frank P. Derris of said State and County, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and annulling all others by me heretofore made.

Item One. I desire and direct, that my body be buried in a decent and Christian-like manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition in life.

Item Two. I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without unnecessary delay, by my executor hereinafter appointed.

Item Three. I give and bequeath unto my beloved fiancée, Miss Dorothy Haddesk, the sum of one thousand (\$1000.00) dollars, to be paid by my executor out of any funds available; provided however, the said Miss Dorothy Haddesk is unmarried at the time of my death.

Item Four. I desire and direct that my executor, after paying the bequest in item three of this will, expend the sum of five hundred (\$500.00) dollars for some good Christian cause, said cause or the purpose for which said sum is to be expended to be selected by my dear Mother, if she is in life; and if my mother is not in life, then by my father; and if neither my mother or father is in life, or, if in life and fail or refuse to make the selection, then said selection to be made by my executor. IT is immaterial with me how said bequest shall be used, provided it is used in a way to advance the cause of Christianity.

Item Five. All the residue of my estate, both real and personal, I give, bequeath and devise unto my brothers and sisters, share and share alike, the while or children of any deceased brother or sister taking the part belonging to the deceased brother or sister.

Item Six. I hereby constitute and appoint ASTER Merritt executor of this my last will and testament, and I expressly confer upon him, as such, full power to administer my estate, excusing him from giving any bond or making any returns to the Ordinary or any other Court or Courts; and I expressly confer upon him the full authority and power to sell the whole or any part of my estate, either real or personal, at public or private sale, with or without notice, as he may deem best, and without any order of Court, making good and sufficient title and conveyances to the purchaser or purchasers and holding the proceeds of said sale to the same uses and trusts as hereinafter declared in the several items of this my last will and testament.
