Last Will and Testament of W.E. Hagan.

I, W.E. Hagan, of said State and County, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament.

Item 1. I wish my executor, as soon as possible after my death to pay all of my just debts, if any.

Item 2. If a sale of property shall be necessary, I wish him to sell first my personal property, and not to sell any land that I may own at the time of my death, unless necessary to pay debts after first exhausting personal property, I wish him to select for sale that which can be most advantageously used for that purpose of said personal property or said land, if necessary to sell same and I authorize him to sell the same at public or private sale, as he may see fit, and without obtaining any order from the Ordinary for the sale of the same, and without making any return of the sale to the Ordinary.

Item 3rd. I give to my beloved mother W.C. Hagan and my beloved sister M.E. Hagan, the use of all my property both real and personal, of which I may die possessed, for and during their natural lives, and if the rents, interest and profits of the same should be insufficient to support my mother and sister, or either of them during their natural lives, then my Executor is authorized and hereby directed to expend whatever is necessary for that purpose from the Corpus of the Estate as long as there remains any of the estate.

Item 4th. If either my mother or sister should die, I direct that the executor shall make the same provision for the one surviving that is made in Item 3 of my will, that is the survivor or shall have the profits for and during her natural life, and the Executor shall have the right to sell or expend so much of the Corpus of my Estate as is necessary for her support.

Item 5. It is my Will and I so direct that my Executor sell all of my property both real and personal, that remains after the death of my mother and my sister W.E. Hagan, and divide the same equally among my brothers and the children of my deceased brother and sisters, after first paying expenses of same, I direct him to divide the balance into five equal parts as follows: To my brother John H. Hagan one fifth, To my brother C.H. Hagan one fifth, To P.H. Hagan son of my brother F.E. Hagan one fifth, To the children of my deceased sister W.J. Smith one fifth, and to Frank McGuire the son of my deceased sister S.P. McGuire one fifth.

Item 6. I do hereby appoint my brother C.H. Hagan Executor of this my will, I direct that he be relieved from giving bond and security, making any appointment, or any return to the Ordinary, having full faith and confidence in my brother.
