I, E.H. Selman, of said county and State, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament.

Item 1. I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid.

Item 2. I give, bequeath and devise to my beloved wife, H.I. Selman, all my personal property of whatsoever kind to vest in her absolutely.

Item 3. I give, bequeath and devise to my beloved wife, H.I. Selman, during her natural life, or widowhood, all my real estate of whatsoever kind and wherever situated of which I may die seized and possessed; and if my wife should marry again it is my will and desire that my real estate be equally divided between her and my children then living; and if any of my children should leave descendants they to inherit the share of said deceased child. It is my will and desire that upon the death of my wife that my real estate shall be sold or divided in kind as a majority of my heirs may deem best, and the property or proceeds thereof equally divided between my children then living, or if any be dead leaving children the children of such deceased child to inherit the share belonging to such deceased child.

Item 4. I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife, H.I. Selman Executrix of this my last will and testament, and I direct that she shall not be required to give bond at such, nor to have any appraisal made of my estate, nor shall she be required to make annual returns or otherwise account for any part of my estate going into her hands except as hereinafter directed.
