

GEORGIA, PULTE COUNTY.

I Tallulah F. Henley of the County of Douglas and State aforesaid, being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make this my last will and Testament.

I give, bequeath and devise to my bodily heirs at my death and should any of my bodily heirs depart this life before my death, then his or her part or portion of my property shall go to his or her bodily heirs.

All of the following described realty to-wit:

Half hundred acres of land in the County of Douglas and State of Georgia, said nine hundred acres of land being lots and portions fractions of lot as follows (121) one hundred and twenty one, (130) one hundred and thirty eight (139) one hundred and thirty nine, (140) one hundred and eighteen, (141) one hundred and twenty one, (142) one hundred and twenty one, and (143) one hundred and twenty one, and lying and being in the (1) first district of originally Carroll then Campbell now Douglas County Georgia, a deed to one half interest in the above described land was made to me Tallulah F. Henley by Thomas J. Ballard on the 26th day of September 1891.

And was recorded in the Clerk of the Superior Court of Douglas County Georgia in Book "B" Pages 359 and 360. December 1st, 1891. Four hundred and five acres more or less in the County of Douglas and State of Georgia, said four hundred and five acres of land being lots nos. (122) one hundred and twenty two, and (123) one hundred twenty three lying and being in the first (1) District of Carroll but now Douglas County, Georgia, said (405) Four hundred and five acres more or less was deed to me Tallulah F. Henley by James T. Henley now on the first day of September 1892 and was recorded in the Clerk Office of the Superior Court in Douglas County, Georgia, in Book "C" Pages 365 and 366 January 18th, 1893.

One house and lot in the city of Atlanta, Georgia, on Copper Street and is off of lot of land No. (76) Seventy six in the 14 District of Originally Henry but now Pulton County, Georgia, said lot is in book (40) forty and a part of city lots 118 and 120. Said city lot was deed to me Tallulah F. Henley by Mrs. Margaret F. Cummings on the 31st day of March 1888, deed recorded in Book "B" Page 117 in the clerk office of the Superior Court of Pulton County, Georgia, September 27th, 1889.

I Tallulah F. Henley also give bequeath and devise to

my bodily heirs at my death any and all of my personal property to be divided among my bodily heirs and their bodily heirs the same as my realty above mentioned.

All of my said property both real and personal shall be kept together as one estate no sale or division made of it until all of my minor children or bodily heirs are educated as my children or heirs that are now of age have been educated. And the profits or income of my entire property real and personal shall go as so much thereof as is necessary to support and educate and all of my daughters who are my bodily heirs while her or they remain unmarried shall be supported out of the property or income of any said property.

That when the youngest of my bodily heirs living shall become of age or marry the whole of my property shall be divided equally between my said heirs as the said property and the proceeds be divided between them.

If any one or more of my bodily heir should depart this life before my death leaving no issue or bodily heir or heirs then the portion of my estate that would have gone to him or her or them as the same may be shall go to his or her or them as the same may be brothers and sisters who are my bodily heirs.

I hereby constitute and appoint my sons James T. and Robert L. Henley and my daughter Minnie F. Henley, Executors of this my last will and Testament. The said James T. Robert L. and Minnie F. Henley shall administer on my estate without any pay or percent as the Executors of this my will and should they refuse to act as the Executors of this my last will and Testament without pay for doing so doing. Then he she or they as the case may be shall forfeit their interest in my said property both real, and personal and shall be treated as if they were not my bodily heirs except they be or she shall have the sum of (\$5.00) five dollars each out of my said property.
