

STATE OF GEORGIA.) Last Will and Testament of Richard W. Johnston.
DOUGLAS COUNTY.)

I, Richard W. Johnston, of said State and County, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament.

Item 1. I wish my executor, as soon as possible after my death, to pay all my just debts.

Item 2. I give to my beloved wife Louisa J. Johnston, ten shares of the Farmers & Merchants Bank Stock, the same being ten shares of the Capital Stock of said Bank, situated at Douglasville, Ga. for and during her natural life and at her death to be sold and divided equally among ~~her~~ my children share and share alike.

Item 3. I give to my beloved wife Louisa J. Johnston, six shares of the Capital Stock of the Loisa Cotton Mills, a Cotton Factory at Douglasville, Ga. for and during her natural life and her death to be sold and divided equally among my children share and share alike.

Item 4. I give to my beloved wife the sum of twenty five hundred dollars money or cash to be paid by my executor out of my estate in lieu of all dower orphans support.

Item 5. I direct that my executor sell all of my property not otherwise disposed of in this Will, both real and personal at public outcry and divide the proceeds after paying the above legacies and all expenses equally among my Beloved children to-wit: A.W. Johnston, C.C. Johnston, G.W. Johnston, Ella Boatright formerly Ella Johnston and Jewell Payne formerly Jewell Johnston share and share alike.

Item 6. I direct my executor to divide all the balance of my estate remaining after paying the legacies aforesaid and the expenses equally among my children named in the 5th. item of this my will share and share alike.

Item 7. I do hereby appoint my sons C.C. Johnston and G.W. Johnston executors of this my last will to have as compensation in full for their services the sum of fifty dollars each.
