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Georgia, Douglas County.

I, A.C. Fudd, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all others made by me.

Item I. It is my will and desire that my body be buried in a Christianlike manner, suitable to my station in life and that a suitable mark of respect be placed near my grave.

Item II. It is my will and desire that all my Just debt to be paid as soon as possible after my death.

Item III. I hereby appoint and constitute Dr. W.B. Chandler, President of the Commercial Bank of Atlanta, my executor to carry out this my last will and testament.

Item IV. I hereby give bequeath and devise to my son, W.F. Fudd Jr., my home place in Douglasville, Georgia, and its entire contents, consisting of my present residence and six acres of land, and all buildings thereon; and the entire household and kitchen furniture.

Item V. I hereby give, bequeath and devise to my daughter, Sarah Elizabeth Fudd my Douglas County farm, known as the T.H. Abernethy place near the Chattahoochee river, consisting of about five hundred acres, more or less, of land, and the houses thereon.

Item VI. I hereby give, bequeath and devise to my sons George and Cuthbert, my Virginia farm consisting of about five hundred and thirty five acres of land and buildings thereon, in Chesterfield county, Virginia, near Wesley, Virginia.

Item VII. All of the above bequests are subject to the following limitations and qualifications, to-wit:

It is my will and desire, and I so direct, that my sons, George and Cuthbert, shall keep said Virginia farm, enjoy the rents off of the same, not sell or dispose of same, nor shall they mortgage or otherwise encumber the same, until after the younger one becomes forty years of age. Then they may sell the said farm or keep it as they see fit and proper. At said time my said sons, George and Cuthbert, shall account to my son W.F. Fudd Jr. and my daughter Sarah Elizabeth Fudd, for the difference in value of the said Virginia farm and the bequest of each under this will. It is the purpose of this item to have each of my said children to share equally in property and money so that the aggregate of money and property received by each shall be equal in value and amount.

Item VIII. It is my will and desire, and I do so direct

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that my beloved wife shall enjoy the rents and profits from all of my said property for and during her natural life or widowhood, if it should be necessary for her to so do. If, however, my entire life insurance, which is payable to my beloved wife, be ample to provide her in comfort during said period, then my said children shall enjoy the rents and profits from the property hereby bequeathed to them.
