Item 4th. I hereby make my confidential friend J.J. Kirby, Executor of this will and I relieve him of free making any inventory of my property or appraisement of free giving and bond, and he is required only by this will to probate the will. And he is further relieved of making and returns of his acts to any court whatever.
