I, J.W. Swofford, of said State and County, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament.

Item 1. I wish my Executors, hereinafter named, as soon as practicable after my death to pay all of my just debts if any existing at that time.

Item 3. At the death of my wife, if my daughter Ollie Odessa Swofford has not married, I hereby give and bequeath all of my real estate and personal property, for her use and control, during her life or as long as she remains unmarried.

Item 4. At the death of my wife, if my daughter Ollie Odessa Swofford has married or died before that time, or at the death of my daughter Ollie Odessa Swofford if she survives her mother and remains unmarried, I hereby bequeath to my beloved children D.F. Swofford, J.B. Swofford, R.M. Swofford, A.W. Swofford, J.M. Swofford, J.B. Swofford, Mrs. Adeline Baldwin formerly Adeline Swofford and Ollie Odessa Swofford all of my real estate and personal property to be equally divided between them share and share alike.

Item 5. Should any of my children be dead at the time of the distribution of my estate under the provisions of this will then it is my will and I so direct that the child or children of said deceased child, if any, shall have the share of my deceased child.

Item 6. I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved sons J.M. Swofford and J.B. Swofford the Executors of this my last will and testament and relieve them from giving bond or security.
