

Letter of Emancipation

To J. T. Spauldard, Executor
Whereas J. T. Spauldard, Executor of John Spauldard, deceased, is her true right of said deceased by deed thereof the power of appointing the Emancipation of said Spauldard to the said Spauldard, and to belong and for the better securing the estate and more proper maintenance and education of the said Spauldard and more the integrity and confidence reposed in you I do hereby commit to the said Spauldard and guardian and to the said Spauldard to you the said J. T. Spauldard, you receiving thereof by the acceptance of the said letter thereinto charge me you that you acknowledge her no more than clothing and clothing that you can her to be educated in such manner as shall be suitable to her interest and to secure thereof and that you inquire into and take charge of her estate both real and personal and all other things to which by law you ought to do for your said estate and for the account of all which you shall render to the Court of Orphans of said County on the term in every year during your continuance in office and I do hereby constitute and appoint you the said J. T. Spauldard, Executor of the said Spauldard to her estate.
