In the name of God! Amen!

I, Ann Webb, being of sound & disposing mind, and advanced in years & knowing that I must soon pass from this world, do make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and annulling all others by me heretofore made.

Item First — My will is that all my just debts and funeral expenses shall by my executor hereinafter named, be paid out of my estate as soon after my decease as shall by him be found convenient.

Item Second — I give and bequeath to my daughters Sarah J. Briggs and Mariah Gay and their immediate heirs, and also to my daughter Adeline J. Chapman and my grand son William Gay, each two shares of the stock that I own in the Georgia Rail Road and Banking Company of the State of Georgia; the two shares each to my daughters Sarah J. Briggs and Mariah Gay is given & bequeathed to them and their children.

Item Third — I give and bequeath to my grand sons Franklies J. Chapman and John W. Chapman each one share of the stock that I own in the Georgia Rail Road and Banking Company of the State of Georgia, and if either should die before he is of age, then the surviving one to have both shares.

Item Fourth — I give and bequeath to my grand sons Thomas Davis and Bogkin Withers, each one hundred dollars, to be paid out of the money collected of Williams J. Davis.

Item Fifth — It is my will that the remainder of my property, real, personal or mixed, of which I shall die seized and possessed, or to which I shall be entitled at the time of my decease, be equally divided among all my children, share and share alike.
