 paid, without delay by my Executors hereinafter appointed
 as I am unwilling my creditors should be delayed especially
 as there is no necessity for delay.

3rd Item I give and bequeath and assure to my beloved
 Wife Mary Sagoy with whom I have lived in the closest quiet
 for — years all the revenue of my estate both real and per
 sonal, after the payment of all my just debts to have and to hold
 during her natural life and at her death an equal division to be made
 amongst her children now living

4th Item I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved Wife
 executrix and my worthy friend Elias H. Starr of this my last
 will and testament this September tenth 1855
