lars cash and a cow and calf apiece

Item 2nd

To my son William Bird I give, bequeath,
and devise six pounds of feathers, to
come out of one of the beds. And after
paying all of my just debts, and reserving
one and a half acres, for the graveyard
known as the Mullis graveyard, the bounda-
ries of said grave yard to give an outlet
to the public road.

Item 3rd

Then the remainder to be equally divided
between my daughter-in-law, S. A. Bird,
wife of my son William, my daughter
Sarah A. Mitchell, my daughter Ruth
Bird and my son Lang Mc Bird and
that to my daughter-in-law, S. A. Bird
is to her for life time, and at her death
to her bodily heirs

Item 4th

I hereby constitute and appoint my
son Lang Mc Bird, Executor of this my last
will and testament
