 the following words.

I wish my children to all go back to Mr Thomas
 Baker and that he wanted Mr Thomas Baker to
 take them, and to take care of them and to do what
 was right by them, as he knew he would do.

I wish my best & bestest to belong to my wife
 youngest daughter & my chest & other things I wish
 to go to my children - I wish my action paid, and even
