 but I do not make this implication

 on her not only the devotion of
 Mollie but the great care devotion
 and charge in the rearing and
 education of our younger children
 specially our Samuel

Item 4th My Library at home is to be
 shared but Mollie has the
 right of selecting her share
 first

Item 5th My debt are to be paid by my Executor
 I leave what is due and is due to me
 my share of interest in the business
 of Clark & since all

Item 6th The residue of my property and assets
 according to the equities divided for my family
 one to my wife and one to each of
 my four children the two eldest
 children the balance given my three
 eldest children are to be the executor against
 them as to my daughter Sam 1/2

Item 7th If it is deemed best by my family that
 the business as the Executor should
 the firm of Clark & Sons be con-
 tinued but at the same period such
 claims as are just to them under the
 interest of my Son William Clark

Item 8th If my Son William Clark should
 prefer to own my Texas land he is to
 have them at fairer estimate of value

Item 9th The property of my daughter Mary
 in Texas should the laws of this
 State for protection of Female
 Solers or Female Executors

Item 10th I appoint my wife Mollie Clark
 my eldest daughter my son
 William Clark Executors
 and Executor of this my last will
 & Testament and advise them
 to connect with some of my
 friends as in the proper admin-
 istration of my estate and I
