 possible.

 undrun and Slaves to wit. For and And I will
 and direct their manumission and freedom. It is
 the State of Georgia, I direct my qualified Executors
 to send said Slaves out of the State of Georgia, to
 such place as they may select and that their expenses
 that the whole of this proceedings be conducted according
 to the laws of the State of Georgia, I having no desire
 or intention to violate the spirit or intention or policy
 of such laws I desire that if said Slaves are compelled
 and in any part of the world

I give and bequeath to my wife Mary Floyd
 all and singular the residue of my estate, both
 real and personal, or of whatever kind it may be,
 to dispose of as she may think proper, with the exception
 of the legacies hereinafter mentioned.

I give and bequeath to my nephew William
 B. Floyd two hundred dollars.

I hereby constitute and appoint my friend
 John S. Wares executor of this my last will and testament
 And for his services, beside his regular Commission
 I give him the further sum of two hundred dollars,
 and request him to look after and advise my wife
 in relation to her affairs as she may need his
 advice and direction. May 25th 1851. David Floyd
