I Henry Gaster of the County & State aforesaid, hereby publish and declare this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills.

I do hereby

I hereby give authority to my Executors to sell, privately or publicly as they may judge best, any part or all of my undivided estate, both personal or real, except Port road stock as herein below divided & stated.

After the payment of all my just debts and necessary expenses, I desire that my estate be divided to my wife and children as follows:

To Wm H. Gaster one twentieth part (1/20); to Sarah A. & Giff five five twentieths (5/20); to Eli C. five twentieths (5/20); to Augustus L. two twentieths (2/20); to M. Ella Hargrove two twentieths (2/20); to my wife Julia A. five twentieths (5/20) provided she survives her husband and all claims growing out of our marriage contract, excepted previous to our marriage.

I desire that my shares in the Georgia Port road be divided as follows:

To Julia, my wife ten shares; Eli C. ten shares; Wm H. Gaster five shares; M. Ella Hargrove five shares.

The legacy herein and herefore given to M. Ella Hargrove, is given to her trustee on condition that should she die without a surviving child, the same of her own body then and in that event, all her estate Wm H. Gaster must divide her legacy

present among our other legations.

Dear Sir,

I hereby appoint my sons Wm. H. &
James H. my executors and I do
give Wm. H. trustee and guardian of my
personal property. I do also appoint
James H. & Wm. H. trustee of my real estate
and I do give and bequeath to Wm. H. & James H.
all of my property and all of my estate
with full power of sale of same.
