fore make this my last Will and Testament hereby over-
ruling all others heretofore made by me

Item first I give and devise that my body be
buried in a decent and Christian like manner suit-
able to my circumstances and condition in life

Item 2^d I give and devise that all my just
debts be paid by my Executors hereafter appointed

Item 3^d I give and devise that my son in law
John C. Hammett take in possession the three negroes
Henry a boy, Henry a girl and Raven a boy and
keep them until the time of the three negroes were
amount to and pay off all my just debts after
wards dispose of as herein after directed

Item the 4th I give and bequeath to my son in
law John C. Hammett Henry a boy with all the
right in any manner pertaining thereto

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my son Samuel
Hammett my negro boy Raven with all the right per-
taining in any manner whatsoever

Item 6th I give and bequeath to my son Robert
C. Hammett my negro girl Henry with all the right
appertaining in any manner whatsoever

From the 7th I hereby witness and affirm my
 faith sworn Peter Smith and William Hammond
 Executors of the my last Will and Testament this
 March the 18th 1849
