Item 1st It is my Will and desire that my
 body shall be buried in a decent and
 Christianlike manner suitable to my

rank and station in life by last
 I must will release to be given as at
 at least 700 Dollars to the heirs and
 next and death of our Lord and Saviour
 Jesus Christ

Item 2nd It is my will and desire that all my just
 debts shall be paid as soon after my death as
 possible by my Executors hereinafter named
 and appointed

Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my beloved
 wife Sarah Richards all my property
 both real and personal of every kind of
 which I am now possessed or may be
 hereafter possessed in her own right
 and will it stand she please to sell the
 same at her death or during her life
 at will

Item 4th It is my Will and desire that my daughter
 Smith the wife of my son James
 Ligg or hereafter L. Davidson my son
 in law shall have any share or part in my
 Estate or any Control in any manner
 thereof

Item 5th It is my will and desire that my people
 shall be my Executors and do hereby name
 and appoint her as such of this my last
 will and Testament
