 Newton County, In the name of God Amen.
 I Stephen Huson of the County and State aforesaid
 being in full health and of sound mind and memory, well known
 that it is appointed unto all men to die, and that I must shortly depart and
 be no more known among the living, do make and ordain this my last
 Will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills theretofore made by
 me I commit my body to the earth in decent christian burial, and
 my soul to God, who gave it, humbly ^{trusting} for salvation through the atoning
 merits of Jesus Christ.

Item first, It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid as soon
 as convenient after my death.

Item second, I give and bequeath unto my two sons Stephen D. Huson
 and Edward O. Huson all my lands containing four hundred and fifty five
 acres more or less (455) So of lots eighty two (82) and eighty three (83)
 of the fifty acres not sequestered all lying in the tenth (10) district
 of originally Henry but now Newton County, with all the improvements
 on the said lands, and one negro man named Sam one negro woman
 named Esther and her child Jude, and all the future income of the female
 slaves hereafter to come, and if the said Stephen D. Huson never returns
 above stated, the said Edward O. Huson is to have all the lands and negroes
 above stated, and the said Edward O. Huson after my death is to take

possession of the above stated lands and negroes and control it as
 his individual property, either in rent hire or sale of said lands
 and negroes, and is not to be held responsible to the said Stephen D. Huson
 for any rent hire interest or income, but is only responsible for
 one equal half of the above stated lands and negroes.

Item third, I give and bequeath unto the heirs of my deceased daughter
 Olive Swan one negro man named Green.

Item fourth, I give and bequeath unto the heirs of my deceased daughter
 Mary Ann Copeland one negro man named George.

Item fifth, It is my will and desire that the old negro woman Nell
 be left free to go where and live with whom she pleases.

Item sixth, I give to the child or children of my deceased son Peng-
 field Huson five dollars and no more.

Item Seventh It is my will and desire that the remaining part of my estate, such as horses, cattle, hogs, wheat, corn, fodder, hay, and various plantation tools, household and kitchen furniture, with every article be sold, and the effects of sale to be divided between my son Edward C. Huson and the heirs of my late deceased daughter Olive, Susan and Mary Ann Copeland my son Edward C. Huson have one third of the sale of said property and the remaining part to be equally divided between the said heirs.
