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that any operation be and they are hereby clothed with a discretion to postpone the sale in said clause mentioned to such time as they may deem best for the interest of the decedent and legatee provided the postponement does not extend beyond the close of the third year after my death. In the mean time are to continue until the the plantations at my death, the expenses of said sale, except under such arrangements, the expenses of carrying them into effect or not by cash the annual income, but as soon as the property falls short of supporting itself as soon as the year the date is to be affected as soon as it can be without prejudice to the estate.

Item 2nd I hereby appoint my son Henry L. Graves my executor with those already appointed.
