Newton County In the name of God Amen, I James Briggs
 of the said County & State, being of sound
 disposing mind and memory, but of feeble health, do hereby
 make public and declare the following to contain my last Will
 & Testament - hereby revoking any & all other wills & bequests or
 either at any time hereafter made by me

Item 1st I give and bequeath to my Wife Amelia
B. Briggs, a cash legacy of one hundred dollars, also the property,
 personally, which she brought into the co-partnership, consisting of
 one bed, bedstead & furniture, some & one chest, also the
 use & service of one negro woman, of the name of Pearce and du-
 ring my said Wife's natural life or widowhood the request
 to my wife in this item mentioned is intended to be in lieu
 of Pearce, or an equivalent therefor

Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my two children
 or my present Wife (one of the children named Elizabeth
Bradford Briggs, the other child has no name) the sum of
 seven hundred and fifty dollars each, to be given in
 cash.

Item the 3^d I do give and bequeath to my said two
 children, by my last marriage & to wit the said two chil-
 dren and to, in the surviving item, the negro woman Pear-
ce the title and possession of the said woman Pearce to
 go to & be vested in the said two children immediately upon
 the death or marriage of my said wife. The survivor of the
 said Pearce if any to follow the title of said Pearce

Item 4th I give & bequeath to my friend Lizabell
McKlaine friend of the County of Henry in trust for the
 sole & separate use of my daughter Eliza A. Morrow &
 her children, one negro girl by the name of Margaret, a
 about twelve or thirteen years of age - the said negro the
 girl & her increase to be held by the said trust for

the 24th 1822 I purchase one hundred & eighty
 of my own daughter & daughter
 Item 5th I give and bequeath to my daughter
 Mary Elizabeth George, one negro woman by the name
 of Mary about twenty years of age together with her
 future increase, also I give to my said daughter Mary
 Elizabeth George, three of the children of the said woman Mary &
 their increase the names of the three negro children given
 to the said Mary E. George, are Anna Jane, George Anne
 & Frank - Also I give to the said Mary E. George one
 certain bedstead and furniture, & one fine mantle
 Item 6th I give and bequeath to my daughter Maria
 Matilda George, one negro woman by the name of
 Matilda about twenty three years of age with her future
 increase Also I give to my said daughter Maria M.
 George a negro boy by the name of Abby (being the
 child of Matilda) also one leather bedstead and
 furniture.

Item 7th I give and bequeath to my son John
 George, one negro boy, by
 the name of Henry about fifteen years of age, also
 to said son George I give one negro girl named
 as Charity, about four years of age.

Item 8th I give and bequeath to my son Daniel
 E. George one negro boy, by the name of Daniel about
 ten years of age, also one girl by the name of Cynthia
 about eight years of age, together with her increase.

Item 9th I give and bequeath to my son James Daily
 George, one negro girl by the name of Mary about eight
 years of age & her increase. Also one negro girl named about
 four years of age & her increase - also one negro boy by
 the name of Thomas about five years of age.

Item 10th It is my will, that at hereby order &
 avail that my negro man Paulina which I purchased

for my service for the purpose of George's estate with all and sundry
 my said son James's estate of my own purchase & his own purchase,
 all their children in this will be sold, & the same being done
 four together with all my interest in any other estate bequeathed
 to me at the death of my father, so that so the said four I may
 have in hand and receive of sale, to satisfy as much debt
 as may be necessary to the payment of part of the said debts
 before bequeathed to my wife & my two children by my
 first wife, then with a sufficiency from the same sale to
 satisfy to be satisfied to be satisfied & satisfaction of my first
 intention to George, Daniel E. George & James D. George, they
 are however not to be sold in such order as at school
 reached in about the same manner & extent, I have reserved
 my other children - the same money to be paid by the County
 Court of Newton County - for the balance a summing sum from the
 first & advance to be equally divided between Mary Matilda
 Anna Jane for the use & separate use of John E. George & her
 children Mary Anne, George, Maria M. George, Christian
 E. George, Daniel E. George, and James D. George.
