keeps her cloths in & one set of European plates
to belong to her the said Sarah Phillips her
life time, or during her remaining with some
Phillips, and the said property to belong to
my son Joseph Phillips at our death or
renewal from him.

Also as to my son Joel Phillips the my son

John Phillips & my daughter Mary
Phillips & my son Daniel Phillips &
daughter Sarah Sarah Hughs & my son
Solomon Phillips & my son Elijah Phillips
and my son James Phillips & my daughter
the Abigail Hinchman & the heirs of
my deceased daughter Priscilla George

to be given and bequeathed to the said
the property then subsisting before as I
considered to be their part of Estate.
Also I do give to my son James Phillips
two beds and furniture bequeathed to me
left to my wife with all the other house
hold and kitchen furniture together with all
the plantation tools and one bay Mare
and all my stock of Cattle and sheep
standing and past together with all
my property or effects of any kind and
for the said James Phillips to pay all
my debts.

Also I do leave James Parnall and
son James Phillips my Executors to trans-
act the business of my will and I do
hereby declare and acknowledge this will
to be my last will and testament and
do annul all other wills.

do hereunto set my hand and for my seal
this fourteenth day of June in the year
of our lord One thousand Eight hundred
and thirty one.
