Item 3rd

Robinson, the house and lot in Newborn and two hundred acres of land, (the seventy acres purchased with the house & lot being a part of it) as long as she remains single, but in the event she should marry, then the house and lot and the land, to be a part and parcel of my estate.

Item 4th

I desire that when my youngest living child becomes of age, that my estate be closed up, and divided amongst my child drum and beloved wife Shaw and I share alike.

Item 5th
