 blessed be almighty God for the same do make &
 display this my last will and testament in manner
 & form following to wit first I will that all my
 Just debts be paid second I will unto my beloved
 wife Catharine Webb all my property both real &
 personal during her natural life or widowhood or
 until my youngest child arrives to the age of
 twenty one years. Then my property to be equally
 divided as follows viz my wife Catharine Webb
 an equal part of my estate my Daughter Sarah
 Webb an equal part of my estate my Daughter
 Martha Webb an equal part of my estate my
 Son Levi (r) Webb an equal part of my estate Eliza
 Webb an equal part of my estate My Son John Clark
 Webb an equal part of my estate and I do hereby
 ordain and appoint my Brother Levi Webb
 and my Brother-in-law Levi Webber my lawful
 executor of this my last will and testament and
 I do hereby declare this my last will and testament
 revoking all other former wills by me made the witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
 24 day of February 1836
