Item the third— I will that at or after the death of my beloved
wife the following distribution of my estate be the real and
personal be made.

Item the fourth— I will that my debts shall be equally divided
between my two sons Paul and James.

Item the fifth— I will that my four daughters namely Elizabeth
Ezra Nancy Jane by their shares & Susannah & Thomas
each have twenty five Dollars.

Item the sixth— I will that my executor at the death of my beloved
wife take into their possession my two negroes namely Cuffy and
Tom and hold them in their possession till John becomes
becomes twenty one years of age if he should not be that at
the death of any of my wife at which time if then there
be no law in the State of Georgia at that time by which
they can be emancipated I will that my executor take the
said two negroes namely Cuffy and Tom to some state in
the Union where they can obtain their emancipation and
to perform the course prescribed by the law of that state
to which they may go made and provided for the emanci-
pation of people of colour that they may be recognized
in that state as free people of colour.

Item the seventh— I will that my son James also have a horse
worth sixty Dollars, a saddle and bridle.

Item the eighth— I will that all the balance of my estate
not disposed above be equally divided amongst my
children viz Timothy Jones, Elizabeth Jones, Polly
Jones, Elizabeth Jones, Nancy Jones, by their shares
Susannah Jones, William Jones, Paul Jones and
James Jones.

Item the ninth— I will that my two sons William Jones
