indebted to me to a considerable amount the value
of which I give to my three children Elizabeth
& Mary & Sarah & Anne and thereby
exclude them from any further interest in my
estate.

Item 2nd The whole of my estate I leave to be con-
sidered divided between my daughters Mary
Elizabeth, William, Richard, John, Charles &
Thomas & Anne.

Item 3rd It is my will and wish that all my
property shall be sold at the discretion of my
Executors, having charge to pay and do of
youngest child, being sold together.

Item 4th It is my will and wish that such
only, Charles & Thomas & Anne may have &
leave as my Executors, having and speaking that
some one or all of them may act out the
my will and last testament.

I do hereby & do hereby set my own proper
hands and seal, this the Eighth day of October
in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight
Hundred and thirty One.
