I Samuel A. King, of the
State of Georgia
Newton County

State & County aforesaid, being an invalid,
believing that I may shortly depart
this life, I have it right, both as respects
myself & family, that I should make a
disposition of my property with which a
kind Providence has blessed me, so
therefore make this my last will & test-
ament and hereby revoking all others
heretofore made by me,

Now 1st = I desire that my body be buried
as a decent & Christianlike manner
suitable to my circumstances in life.
My soul I trust shall return to rest
with the God who gave it.

Now 2nd = I desire & direct that my just
debts be paid by my executor to here-
inafter named.

Now 3rd = I desire & direct that my executor
have placed over my grave,

a granite box tomb stone over my
grave, with suitable inscription.
Now 4th = I desire and direct that what
money I have on hand be equally divided
between my wife, Francis H. Martha L.
& daughter, as they are collected to be equally
divided as before named, also a life
policy in the Southern Life Insurance
Co. collected to be divided as the
rest, also to divide the household and
stock farming utensils &c. to such the
above named wife, daughter & son.
The lands belonging to the estate, until
financial matters will authorize the
sale of such property, & the proceeds
equally divided between the above
named heirs.

Now 5th = I desire & direct that in the
event my wife Francis H. Martha L.
or Augustus L. King shall die, then
the property shall return to those
living.

Now 6th = I desire & direct that my grand
child James E. Daniel (only child
of my daughter James E. Daniel
deceased) when she is of lawful age
have five hundred dollars to be held
and paid to her out of my estate
by my executor hereinafter named.

Now 7th = I hereby appoint & constitute
my son Augustus L. King, Executor
of my last will & testament.
In Henry the 6th if my grand child
James L. Daniel dies before she is of
age the amount to be divided equally
between my heirs living & dead above.
This Oct 20th 1876, Samuel A. King (S)

signed, sealed, and subscribed
 before me as his last will and
 testament in the presence of us who
 subscribed our names hereto as
 witnesses in the presence of said
 testator (at his special request) and
 of each other.
