land in any wise belonging during her natural life or
widow hood in the event she should marry again the land
shall be sold and the proceeds equally divided between my
wife and children (to wit) Edeline R Parsh & Nancy A
& James Madison

Item I declare and direct that my Executor should
dispose of my stock and present crop or keep it as he
please as he thinks best for the use of my family without
any public sale

James M Leflurich my Executor of this my last
will and testament
