Washington Lloyd of said
State and County, being of sound and
disposing mind and memory and intending
in age, knowing that life is uncertain
and that I shall not be able to support
my family and myself with the
income of the property which I have
which I have devised and bequeathed
I do hereby make this my last will and
testament, hereby revoking and annulling
all others by me made heretofore.

First I desire and direct that my body be
buried in a decent and Christianlike
manner, suitable to my circumstances
and condition in life in the City of Savannah
or that Sister provided my dear wife shall
be in said State they shall be buried
shall return to rest with her, and
give it as I wish for Salvation through
the merits and blood of the Lord
and Saviour Jesus Christ

Second I desire and direct that all my just
debts be paid without delay by my
Executors hereinafter named and appointed

Third I desire and direct that my real estate con-
sisting of one hundred acres of land more
or less, shall be divided into two equal parts
of about fifty acres each, and of any
time of my children or heirs hereinafter
named wishes to take said ac-
timents at a price agreeable to
all my heirs hereinafter named they
shall have the right to do so provided
the amount of said price paid and
repaid upon said not amount to more

than their share of my estate, and in that event
those taking the less part or allotments shall
pay over the amount exceeding their distributive
share, and of the two allotments can not be so
arranged satisfactorily, then I direct my estate
herein named to sell my real estate for
money as benefits directed.

Fourth It is my desire, and I so direct that as soon
as practicable after my death that all my per-
sonal property be sold by my executors herein
after named, and my note and accounts collected
and the proceeds of my estate both real and per-
sonal to be equally divided between the following
my heirs, Mary A. Lloyd, George W. Lloyd,
Susan T. King, J. D. Black, Robert L. Lloyd
and Alice Roberts, each of the above named heirs
to have their distributive share paid over to them
by my Executors except my daughter, Alice Roberts,
and I direct that my equal share be placed in
the hands of Geo. W. Lloyd and R. L. Lloyd, and
that they must be done in a home for her
taking the title to be same in their name as
trustees for her and her heirs (totally).

Fifth In addition to an equal share in my estate after
my death I direct that a certain note signed by
me and now in the possession of R. W. Lloyd, dated
22^d of December 1888, for about three hundred
and forty seven dollars, made payable to my
daughter Alice Roberts, and united with her equal
share of the estate, shall go into the home to be
purchased for her as above directed. The amount
of this note is necessary to make her equal, the
others above named having received in my lifetime
that amount.

Sixth I desire that (and so direct) my grand children
the body heirs of my son John D. Lloyd now
deceased, nor his wife Lucy Lloyd shall
not share in my estate for the reason

that said John W. Loyd in his life time
had received his full share and more of
my property
