- Item 5th I give to Sarah Stewart Twenty Dollars
- Item 6th My Will and desire is that the Rem-
 ainder of my estate be equally divided
 into Seven equal Shares by my Executors
 hereinafter appointed by me and divi-
 ded as follows. My Sister Mary Thompson
 receive her heirs to draw One fourth
 which is one Share and that one
 Share to be divided into four equal
 parts as follows. J. J. Thompson one
 fourth and Sarah Stewart wife
 of W. F. Stewart one fourth and
 J. F. & D. A. Stewart one fourth
 Mary and James T. Boyd

one fourth equally divided between them
and that I shall the all of the said heirs
whose names interest in my estate
