I William H Mann being of sound disposing mind and memory do make known and declare this to be my last will and testament in the words following to wit

It is my desire that my wife Frances Mann keep possession of all my worldly effects both real personal and mixed during her natural lifetime, that she provide for the payment of all my debts, as soon as practicable after my death, and at her death all the property, except such as perish by use be equally divided amongst all our children.

I do hereby appoint my son-in-law Francis Mott my lawful executor to this my will.
