of the said Isabelle Blake George a negro man and Abby
a negro woman and Betsy a negro child and all my household
furniture and furniture above my wearing apparel
and also one cow and calf and one sow and pigs the above
the above named negroes George and Abby to go to the use of her the
said Isabelle Blake during the lifetime of her the
said Isabelle Blake then to go to the use of the said Morgan
Isabelle Blake during her life time and then to her the
said Morgan Isabelle Blake her law full heirs

3rd Item I also give to William M. Blake a negro boy
by the name of Joe by her the said William M. Blake
making an equal division of the value of said negro Joe
among the rest of his brothers and his sister Jane Bell
Blake

4th Item I do hereby give all my property which is
not given in the above and foregoing Items to be equally
divided between William M. Blake and his brothers and
his sister Jane Bell

hand and seal this the 17th day of June in the year of
our Lord One Thousand eight hundred and forty seven.
